Ludwig van Beethoven wrote his 32 piano sonatas between 1795 and 1822 Although originally not intended to be a meaningful whole, as a set they compose one of the most important collections of works in the history of music Hans von Bülow called them "The New Testament" of the piano literature (Johann Sebastian Bach's The Well-Tempered Clavier being "The Old Testament") Beethoven's piano sonatas came to be seen as the first cycle of major piano pieces suited to concert h...

THE SONATA FORM AND ITS USE IN BEETHOVEN'S MASTER ...

Beethoven's piano sonatas are possibly the greatest achievement in piano literature, perhaps in all musical literature It has been said that if the forty-eight preludes and fugues of Bach's "Well-tempered Clavier" were to be considered the "Old Testament" of music, then Beethoven's thirty-two sonatas would have to be the "New Testament

Beethoven Ahead of His Time: Sonata in C major No. 21 Op. 53

A majority of Beethoven's compositions are for piano, and his thirty-two piano sonatas are essential milestones in the evolution of piano literature

Beethoven began the exploration of the piano and the maximalization of the sonata. The sonatas exemplify Beethoven's compositional periods and the evolution of the sonata form and the piano.

later was contained in his piano sonatas. A sonata is a piece for solo instrument and contains three or sometimes four movements, each with a different tempo (speed). At this stage Beethoven was beginning to go deaf, though the problem wasn't severe enough yet for him to give up performing. The situation worsened rapidly in the next few years.

Beethoven's death, piano sonatas were largely heard in private surroundings; in Vienna Beethoven made his mark in the aristocratic salon, gave some of his patrons piano lessons, and dedicated sonatas (and works in other genres) to a select few. The cultivated bourgeois played the piano; Beethoven also had middle-class students,

Beethoven wrote his first sonata for cello and piano. Ludwig van Beethoven (1770-1827) wrote his first cello sonata in 1796 while he was travelling in Germany. This sonata is paired with his cello sonata in G minor Op 5, Op 5, No 2. In the court of Friedrich Wilhelm II, the King of Prussia, to whom these sonatas were dedicated, the two

Non-Tonic Settings of the Primary Tone in Beethoven Piano ...

Beethoven piano sonatas through Op 57 include at least eleven examples of initial primary tones set by non-tonic chords. (In later piano sonatas this technique seems to be less common.) This procedure appears in sonata-form and ternary-form movements in both fast and slow
