scaffolding is an instructional structure through which the teacher models the strategy or task of learning and then moves this responsibility to the children. According to Tharp and Gallimore (1988), learning, especially in schools, can be seen as 'achievement with help' (cited Pollard & Tann, 1993, p111).
